ADVENT A Season of Preparation & Anticipation of the Coming of Our Savior

The Advent wreath eternity symbolizes and continuous life. The four candles represent the light of and the Christian Christ concepts of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. A candle is lit each week marking the progression of the four weeks of Advent. Traditionally, the candles are three purple and pink. Many **ELCA** one churches use blue candles to emphasize hope and anticipation as we await our royal savior. Blue symbolizes the hope of Christ's coming, like the anticipation of dawn breaking over a dark night sky. The white Christ Candle in the center of the Advent



wreath is lit on Christmas to remind us of Christ's abiding presence and his light within us. Just as a candle can give us light, Jesus lights our hearts and lives, even in the darkest night and even when we don't feel loving or happy. Advent in 2025 is November 30 to December 24.






Concordia Supports.... A Giving Tree

As of this printing, no decision has been made as to where the items will be given. Last year they were happily received by the North Country Family Health Center.


